## YMCA TRAINING OF TRAINERS (TOT)

A Transformation Leadership Journey

## February 10-15, 2025 | YMCA Camp Lakeside, Nilshi, Mumbai

The six-day YMCA Training of Trainers (TOT) Workshop held from February 10-15, 2025, at YMCA Camp Lakeside, Nilshi, Near Pune, was a transformative experience for 42 participants from across YMCA Centres in India. The event organized by Bombay YMCA along with the National Council of YMCAs of India (NCYI) aimed to enhance leadership capabilities, promote youth empowerment and equip participants with the skills to plan, design and implement impactful programs.

#### Day 1: Monday, February 10, 2025

The inauguration of the event began with a warm welcome and orientation of the campsite by Mr. Austin Kunder, General Secretary of Bombay YMCA. The opening ceremony included the felicitation of Mr. Eldo N. Varghese, National General Secretary, and Mr. Austin Kunder. General Secretary of Bombay YMCA

The first session of the workshop was led by Mr. Eldo N. Varghese, National General Secretary, who kicked off the event with an insightful presentation on Mission-Driven Programs. He emphasized the profound calling of every YMCA professional to engage in a mission rooted in faith, with a specific focus on empowering youth and fostering community-oriented initiatives.

Mr. Eldo spoke passionately about the importance of developing a Christ-centered character as a foundational trait for YMCA professionals. He stressed the significance of being deeply committed to serving young people, particularly those facing crises. He further highlighted the values of detachment, integrity, and self-reflection, which are essential for leadership.

In his session, Mr. Eldo encouraged the participants to not only improve their professional skills but to also cherish the journey of working with young people. He urged them to plan and implement programs that would engage youth, creating opportunities for them to build meaningful connections with both faith and their community. The evening concluded with a debriefing session to reflect on the learning.



#### Day 2: Tuesday, February 11, 2025

The morning began with a body booster session led by Mr. Amul Raj, Sr. Secretary of Bombay YMCA. After breakfast, the morning devotion was conducted by Mr. Ashish Throat, Secretary, Finance and Administration, NCYI, who reflected on how Christ nurtured love, comparing individual versus collective excellence.

Mr. Rajan S. Mathews then presented the first session on Strategic Planning, Innovation and Future Trends in Leadership Development. He discussed the role of a leader in guiding organizations, emphasizing strategic planning for success and leadership qualities such as humility, assertiveness and the ability to organize resources.

Mr. Sunder Singh B., Associate National General Secretary, led a session discussing 'Vision 2030' adopted by World Council of YMCAs, outlining the four pillars of impact i.e. Community Wellbeing, Meaningful Work, Sustainable Planet and Just World. The afternoon was spent engaging in outdoor activities on team-building, archery and swimming followed by a Cricket Tournament.

#### Day 3: Wednesday, February 12, 2025

This was followed by a session on Program Monitoring and Evaluation by Mrs. Sunita Atul Meshramkar, where she discussed the significance of assessing programs for improvements and sustainability.
